



**Collegiate Ambassador Scholarship Rubric:**

Each application submitted by the deadline will be read by the members of the Collegiate Committee, USAC National Coordinators and members of USAC staff and graded according to the following rubric on a scale of 120 points: 20 point for the resume and 100 points for the essay, with each question being worth 20 points, 5 for grammar/spelling and 15 for content

**Resume – 20 points**

Format/Appearance	5 Points
Grammar/Spelling	5 Points
Content	10 Points

**Essay – 100 Points**

Question 1 – How has climbing impacted your collegiate experience?	20 Points (15 for content, 5 for grammar/spelling)
Question 2 – What are you doing to help grow collegiate climbing?	20 Points (15 for content, 5 for grammar/spelling)
Question 3 – What are you doing to help dismantle barriers of access within your local climbing community? Are there any specific DEI initiatives you have helped promote?	20 Points (15 for content, 5 for grammar/spelling)
Question 4 – What part of being in the collegiate climbing community do you find most rewarding?	20 Points (15 for content, 5 for grammar/spelling)
Question 5 – If given \$1500 to improve/promote climbing at your institution, what would you utilize those funds for?	20 Points (15 for content, 5 for grammar/spelling)
