All manual therapy and therapeutic or recovery modalities must be Observable and Interruptible.

- 1** Another Adult Participant must be present
- 2** Minor Athletes must remain fully or partially clothed
- 3** Documented consent from a parent or legal guardian is required annually
- 4** Providers must narrate steps in modalities before taking them and seek assent of Minor Athletes throughout the process

- 2 Do not use photographic or recording capabilities in this space
- 3 Adult Participants must not shower with Minor Athletes*
- 4 Adult Participants must not behave in a manner that intentionally or recklessly exposes themselves to a Minor Athlete

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MAAPP-At-A-Glance

**Exceptions: individuals who meet the MAAPP's Close-in-Age Exception, or if the shower is a part of a pre- or post- activity rinse while wearing swimwear.*
